



## FALL MEETING SPONSORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Most of the sponsorship opportunities for the 2009 Fall Meeting focus on the next generation geoscientists. Between 2600 and 3000 students will attend the meeting. About 700 US and international students are expected to apply for travel grant to attend the meeting and to present their research for the first time. **AGU would like to distribute 150-200 sponsored student travel grants.** Student events provide an excellent opportunity for peer-to-peer networking and interaction with senior scientists. **Sponsorships are available for 2 student events and one student program.** Also, a number of Outstanding Student Paper awards will be given, and **AGU seeks 200 gift certificates from publishers** as “prizes.”
