



AGU 2012 Subscriptions

In 2011, AGU simplified its price model, making the top collection of journals covering the Earth and space sciences better value and easier to purchase. We added new subscription terms, consortia licensing opportunities, and an expanded term of 16 years of content included in a “current” subscription. In 2012, we look forward to adding even more value to our subscriptions and expanding access to AGU content.

With continuing economic pressures facing all our customers, we know it’s vital that AGU offer the best value for its content. AGU will extend its special online package pricing for 2012, allowing time for AGU to analyze usage and finalize our pricing policy for 2013.

AGU journals continue to rank highly, according to the Thomson Reuters 2010 Journal Citations Reports. AGU continues to outperform bigger competitors, with seven journals in the **top 10%** in the categories of Geosciences, Geochemistry and Geophysics, Environmental Sciences, Paleontology, Limnology, Meteorology and Atmospheric Sciences, Oceanography, and Water Resources.

Paleoceanography again leads the category of Paleontology – it has been #1 in this category since 1995. *Journal of Geophysical Research* received 145,689 citations in 2010—26% of citations in the category of Multidisciplinary Geosciences. And *Reviews of Geophysics* has consistently dominated the Geochemistry and Geophysics category with an impact factor that has jumped almost 40% in the past five years, currently holding the influential impact factor of 9.538.

Current Subscriptions

Starting in 2011, AGU’s current journal subscriptions include content from 1996 (or the first year of publication of a title if later than 1996) to 2012, providing up to **16 years** of content in each current subscription. Current subscriptions are now an ever-extending front file, every year offering more content in a single subscription.

AGU also offers institutions an online subscription to *Eos*, the weekly premier international newspaper on Earth and space sciences, covering science in the social and political areas. Readers rely on *Eos* to keep up with the latest research, news, book reviews, and scientific meetings as well as announcements of grants, fellowships, and job opportunities.
