

I Reviewed A Top Downloaded/Cited Paper FAQs

Thank you for your work as a reviewer for AGU publications. Our journals would not be valuable without rigorous peer review, and we truly thank you for helping to ensure that sound science is published.

What is considered a top downloaded paper?

Top downloaded papers generated the most downloads for an AGU journal amongst articles published between January 2018 and December 2019. In this campaign we recognized contributions of those who reviewed the top 10% of a journal's most downloaded articles during that time frame.

What is considered a top cited paper?

Top cited papers must be part of a journal's five top-cited articles published between January 2018 and December 2019.

How did you know I reviewed one of the above listed papers?

AGU used peer review records to identify volunteers that contributed their expertise and guidance to authors, helping develop their submissions into leading research that published across our journal portfolio. That information remains safeguarded by AGU's publications team who adhere to the strict confidentiality of the peer review and any connections to you and the paper(s) in which you reviewed will remain protected.

Are these the top downloaded or cited papers of all time?
